

MILITARY FUNERAL.—On Saturday morning the funeral took place at the Luton General Cemetery of Pte. George C. Wade, 3/1st North Midland Field Coy., Royal Engineers. Deceased, who was only 22, died somewhat suddenly at his billet, 277, Hitchin-road, Luton, and his home was at Skelton, Stoke-on-Trent. Accorded full military honours he now rests in a quiet corner of the Cemetery. The coffin was conveyed from Messrs. T. and E. Neville's mortuary, Castle-street, to the Cemetery on a gun-carriage provided by the 2/1st North Midland R.F.A., and was covered with a Union Jack on which were placed deceased's cap and bandolier, and flowers from comrades. The mourners were Mr. Enoch Wade (father), Miss Wade (sister), Mrs. Waller (at whose home deceased passed away), and Miss Waller. The Rev. E. E. Ormiston conducted the service of interment. Comrades of deceased carried him to the grave, over which three volleys were fired and the Last Post sounded, and there was a long following party. There were wreaths from the family, his comrades, and Mrs. and Miss Waller.
